

Lupin Cottage at Boningale Manor

Lupin Cottage's ground floor is open plan and measures a generous 30' by 15'. To one side is a high quality kitchen and dining set for 6, the other presents a two-settee lounge with large television. Any draughts are managed out by the provision of heavy tapestry hangings.



Lupin Cottage is family- and visitor-sized. If you want to exploit its scale, we can readily provide guests with additional equipment.

Two bedrooms, each about 15' by 10½' with their own 6' x 5½' ensuite shower/WC, are approached by their own narrow stairs with robust handrails. Each bedroom can be a twin or double (with sufficient space for a cot) and the wall that separates the two bedrooms is very effectively sound-insulated.



Lupin Cottage enjoys access to the Sunken Garden with its sheltered southern aspect, its barbeque and bowls, and a private covered airing line.



Four Star rated Lupin Cottage is named to commemorate Boningale Manor's role as the home of the modern 'Russell' Lupin. James Baker enticed the famous horticulturalist Russell down from Yorkshire and here, at Boningale, Russell developed the multi-coloured Lupin. Baker made so much money from this endeavour that he was able to purchase Wolverhampton Wanderers FC chairing the club through the 50's & 60's, the years when Wolves could claim to be the most important football club in Europe! When you visit Lupin Cottage, you will see a photograph of the 9 acre Lupin nurseries, which attracted visitors from miles around.
